

Trinity Tidings

“You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.”
Mark 1:11b

In John Eldredge’s book, *Wild at Heart*, he writes of the burning question in the heart of every boy: “Am I really a man? Have I got what it takes...when it counts?” Until a boy heard an affirmative answer from another man, he cannot become one himself. Most men need to hear the answer to their question from their fathers. On the day of his baptism, Jesus heard those words from His Father!

A couple of weeks ago the assigned Gospel reading for the Sunday was from Mark 1:4-11. It was the account of Jesus being baptized by John in the Jordan River and on that day God, the Father, said these important words: “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” Those could be interpreted as: “I love you, Jesus! I am proud of you! You have what it takes to be the Messiah!” And so it was that after hearing those words and being baptized, Jesus began his three years of ministry leading to his death and resurrection.

As we approach Valentine’s Day we are reminded that all of us, young and old, men and women, married or single, we all need to hear those words. “I love you” are some of the most powerful words ever spoken.

There is an old axiom that says: “Find out what you’re willing to die for and you’ll have a pretty good idea of what you should live for.” Yes, therein we discover where our heart is and what we truly love. Brooke Collins, a resident of Juneau, Alaska revealed what she was willing to die for. Last September she let her dogs out and one of them, a dachshund named Fudge, started to bark. When she looked, she saw Fudge in the mouth of a black bear. She said it was carrying him off “like a salmon”. Collins took off after the two, managed to catch up with them, and did the only thing she could think of: she punched the bear in the nose. Now, I don’t know what kind of right hook Brooke Collins can throw, but the bear dropped the dog and headed off for the mountains! Thinking back upon the incident, Brooke said it was stupid to punch a black bear in the snout to save her dog. All I can say is that she must really love her dog.

This brings us back to Valentine’s Day and our need to hear the words: “I love you.” As I look at the Bible, one thing is crystal clear: God the Father does love you! Jesus was God’s gift of love to the world! He decided that it was worth sending His only Son into the world to save you even if it meant that he would die on a cross. Saving you is the reason Jesus lived and it is the reason that He died.

As on the day the Jesus was baptized so it was on the day you were baptized that God called you by name, declared His love for you, washed away your sins, and brought you into His family! Each day, as you recall your own baptism, He would say those powerful words to you: “I love you!”

Happy New Year Trinity Lutheran (Yes - this does seem like a repeat of January)!

No doubt many of you find these verses familiar because of the song *Turn, Turn, Turn* by The Byrds. Time has a way of humbling us because of our own mortality and limited time on earth. Last month we celebrated New Years as we entered into 2012. Whether watching Dick Clark or a montage of old new stories, entering a new year often causes us to look at our lives from both a forward and backward perspective. We look at what we have done and what we hope to do. In the Christian Church we follow a special calendar known as the liturgical year. Our Christian year starts with Advent in late November and often ends with "Christ the King" Sunday before the next year's Advent. As we go through the church year we first follow the life of Christ: Advent and Christmas for His birth, Epiphany for His life and ministry, Lent and Easter for His sacrifice and resurrection. But after Easter we remember the growth and formation of His church on earth with the season of Pentecost. Interestingly enough, while many contemporary scholars and academics say we live in 2012 CE (Common Era), we are still marking time from 0 AD (Anno Domini) or "in the year of our Lord". Even in the secular world, time is still marked by the coming of the Savior of the Nations.

Scripture does not command we use a liturgical year, but the Church created it and follows it because it helps Christians keep their focus on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. While we use calendars and years to mark and organize the time in our lives, we must always remember that ultimately our time is in God's hand. Rev. Dr. Martin Luther sums this up nicely when he write, "It is not up to us to prescribe the time, manner, or the effect of things that are to be done; and so it is obvious that here our strivings and efforts are unreliable. Everything comes and goes at the time that God has appointed." In our lives we must remember that for everything there is a season, but in everything we have God.

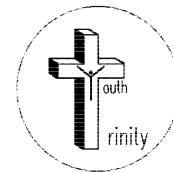
LWML Guild

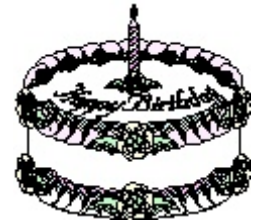

Just imagine a hot meal while sitting at your dining room table. Just imagine pulling up the covers in your nice warm bed. Just imagine.... The 27 member of the IOWAY team were privileged to visit the Urban Street Mission located in the area known as Skid Row and distribute health-hygiene items as well as undergarments. We also helped to serve meals to the guests at the shelter as well as those who came in from living on the streets. I visited with a man who had come to LA to drink himself to death. I was able to share that, though our lives had followed different paths, God still loved and cared for him.

The visit followed four days of working on several floats, including the Lutheran Hour Ministry (LHM) float, for the Rose Parade. Theme of the 2012 parade was "Just Imagine". The LHM float had the theme "God's Promise for All". Just imagine. Millions of people either saw the float as it passed down Colorado Boulevard or on television and they read "He who believe in Jesus shall never die but have eternal life."

Just imagine how God worked in the lives of those on our IOWAY team as well as those we visited with and those who watched us as we worked in serving Him. Thank you for your donations of school supplies, health and hygiene items, as well as socks and undergarments.

Simply Giving Program

You can eliminate the need for writing a check each week/month by signing up for the "Simply Giving" program through Thrivent Financial for Lutherans. Authorization forms can be found on the counter in the middle office. Just fill out the form, attach a voided check and give the form to Bev for submission to the program. Several members of our congregation are current participants and enjoy the freedom of not writing checks! We hope you'll join the program too!

Designating Your Dollars

In 2010 Thrivent Financial for Lutherans provided \$135 million to nonprofit organizations. If you are a qualified Thrivent policy owner, you have the right and the responsibility to designate where you believe Thrivent should spend these funds called "Choice Dollars". If you are eligible to designate funding and do not do so, Thrivent will make the decisions for you, providing funds to a short list of selected national organizations.

If you own a financial instrument (insurance, annuity, etc.) of Thrivent, you are eligible to designate the distribution of your "Choice Dollars" to a listed organization. Trinity Lutheran Church, the Asian congregation and the Sudanese congregation are all on the list of charitable organizations to which the funds could be allocated. Trinity's Campus Ministry, and the Asian & Sudanese ministries are all going to be losing District funding in 4 years and need your support or risk failure. Folders are available by the Elder's desk in the narthex which will help you go online and direct your funds to one of our groups. If you have trouble navigating the system, your local Thrivent agent will help you.
